KOSTAT had consultation meetings with judicial stakeholders including Ministry of Justice, Supreme Prosecutors' Office, Korean National Police Agency, Police Science Institute, and Korean Institute of Criminology and Justice in 2015.

Based on these meetings, KOSTAT proceeded with preliminary research and established a 5-year research plan. In 2020, we drafted the ICCS-based Korean Crime Classification, and in 2021, we undertook a study to improve the matching rate between the provisional KCCS and domestic crime codes.

Recently, we launched the 3rd phase of research for improving the matching rate.

Additionally, efforts will be made to improve classification completeness through the preparation of measures to improve the crime statistics collection system and case studies on the application of international criminal classification.
